Career Ready, formally Career Academies UK is a national charity that links schools with employers to prepare young people for the world of work.

Students take part in a structured two year programme which is during their fifth (S5) and sixth (S6) years at school. The programme is in addition to their school timetable and it includes mentoring, a five week internship and motivational masterclasses and workplace visits.

Each of the students is assigned a mentor who works with them for the duration of the 2 year programme. They are likely to have an important role in supporting the student before and during their internship experience.

We currently have two students on the programme who were in placements for five weeks during the summer holidays, both of the students had the support from their mentors during this time as well as support and guidance from the team they are place in during this work experience period.

On Friday 28th of August the first of 4 Road Safety presentations was held in the VTCC Peterhead, this was delivered by Alan Brown who was a former head of the Grampian Police Road Safety unit and now works with DAB Driving Training delivering and educating the public on safe driving.

DAB Plus Driver Training provides training in a wide range of subjects such as: Learner driver, Fleet driver training including confidence building, Road Familiarisation & Road Safety presentations to name but a few.



This was a hard hitting presentation and showed the dangers of not wearing Seat belts, Speeding, Drink and Drug Driving & Mobile phones. Feedback from some of the apprentices was mainly positive and that even though they found it powerful and hard hitting they found it beneficial as there was a clear message about the dangers of driving.

"I thought this presentation was very hard hitting and really put into perspective as a driver how one simple slip of concentration, one mistake, one "brave" move can cause an entirety of regret or guilt.

Even driving from Wellbank back to my place of work I found myself assessing the road differently and more cautiously."

"I thought the presentation today was really good. It sends out a powerful message exactly how dangerous driving can be if you don't take care whilst on the roads. It made me think about how I will drive in future."

Conrad Ritchie Managing Director Score (Europe) introduced Alan during the first presentation, he addressed the group as follows "We are very concerned for the well-being off all our employees, statistically you are much more likely to be injured travelling to and from work than you are in the work place. We are running these interactive sessions as we want to ensure you are all aware of the consequences of irresponsible driving, you may feel invincible but real life is not like a PlayStation or Xbox game. I do hope you all take a life lesson from this presentation and as always we appreciate your feedback".
