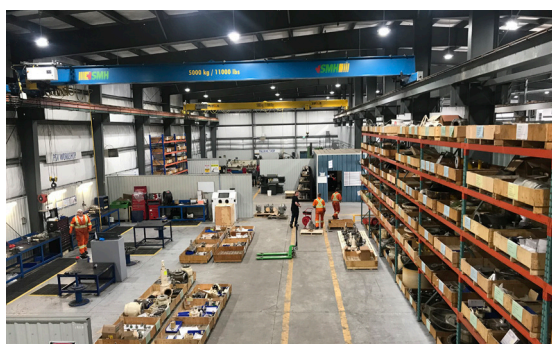

Glenugie Valve Shop Refurbishment

On the 27th June, Score (Europe) Limited was delighted to officially reopen the newly renovated valve shop within the company's Glenugie headquarters in Peterhead. In attendance were Score Europe directors and management, and the Valve Shop Team.

Since opening 25 years ago, the Valve Shop had never been refurbished, and the time had come to update the workshop, including the fitting of new test cells using the latest technology, and new workstations.

Ally Marshall, Deputy Managing Director, made a brief speech advising how the Valve Shop has been the cornerstone of Score (Europe) Limited since the early days of the company. He then explained the history of the Valve Shop, throughout the years from the times down in the old distillery building where equipment was sparse and everyone had to improvise using their intuition. Then on to the current location which was established 25 years ago, but in the early days they had no enclosed walls and quite a few other challenges. Ally then went on to thank the valve shop and maintenance teams for all their efforts over the last few months transforming the Valve Shop into the state of the art workshop which it is today, with a special thanks to Mark Fyvie for managing the project.

Ally then asked Mark, an ex-Score apprentice and the current Valve Shop Team Leader, to come forward and take the honours of officially opening the workshop.

Ally said, "The Valve Shop has always been very close to my heart, I learnt my trade in this department along with quite a few of our current senior management and directors, I then went on to become the first Score Apprentice to become Team Leader of the Valve Shop.

"Over the years we've repaired millions of valves through the valve shop and in turn generated millions of pounds, so it is only very fitting that we are now committing this sort of expenditure upgrading the facility.

"Hopefully some of the current young team members will aspire to be the future DTL's and TL's of the Valve Shop and I truly believe this transformation will make this the flagship workshop within the company".



A Decade of the Ian M Cheyne Building

On the 10th of June Score celebrated a decade of the Ian M Cheyne Building. In 2009 Score Group director, Ian M Cheyne was recognised for his career-long contribution when he received a building named after him. On the day, the unveiling of the red granite plaque bearing his name was shrouded in secrecy so it all came as a great surprise to Ian. Everyone from the building, as well as many managers and directors from Score were present as Ian unveiled the plaque.

Opening in 2003, the turbines and NIK departments, previously based at Glenugie, were first to move into Wellbank forming Score Energy Limited. With the expansion of Score Group, Wellbank has also briefly facilitated Score Training, and is now home to Score's Accounts department, IT and all of the Score Group Directors.

The building is also host to many events held by Score within the Vital Training & Conference Centre (VTCC), including monthly apprentice lectures, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) events to engage local schools; and business events for both the valve and turbine industries.

The majority of the 11,000m² building is used by Score Energy Limited, who provides overhaul, testing, supply and support services to gas turbines, and fuel systems, accessories and auxiliaries. Score Energy's impressive facility consists of various departments, with a machine shop, specialist turbine workshops, extensive stock holding areas and advanced testing facilities. Energy's NIK department uses advanced technology to test components including a state-of-the-art x-ray facility.

Nestled at the rear of the building sits The Sir Frank Whittle's Jet Engine Test Bed, within the GLEN test facility. Ian played a major role in transporting the test bed from its original home in RAF Farnborough to Peterhead, where it was refurbished and redesigned for the 21st century.

Being with Score since 1982, and through various roles, Ian has been testament to many of the successes and developments of the company, including the set-up of a number of Group locations. Ian has always been popular amongst his colleagues, and spent a lot of time over the years travelling around the world, passing on his knowledge and experience to the next generation of Score engineers, leading him to be known globally and in the valve industry as "Dr. Valve". His one million miles an hour work ethic and fast approach to problem solving has also often resulted in him being compared to a burst hose. Although many years have passed since he first joined Score, this enthusiasm and dedication has not waived.

Score would once again like to thank Ian for his dedication and hard work that has lead Score Group plc to become the successful global company it is today.



St John's Open Day

Since the opening of the new Score (Canada) Limited – Eastern Division facility on 23 January 2019, the 20 Maverick Place building housed all front end office staff, Engineering department, projects and contract teams. The additional workshop at this facility is currently being set up to support the Vale Nickel Processing contract and will be completed within the next three months.

A significant renovation of the operations facility at 159 McNamara Drive has also been completed, including a 10,000 ft2 extension. This extension allows the expansion of the machine shop, testing facilities and workshop capacity to better support the local Newfoundland & Labrador market and the continual growth of the company.

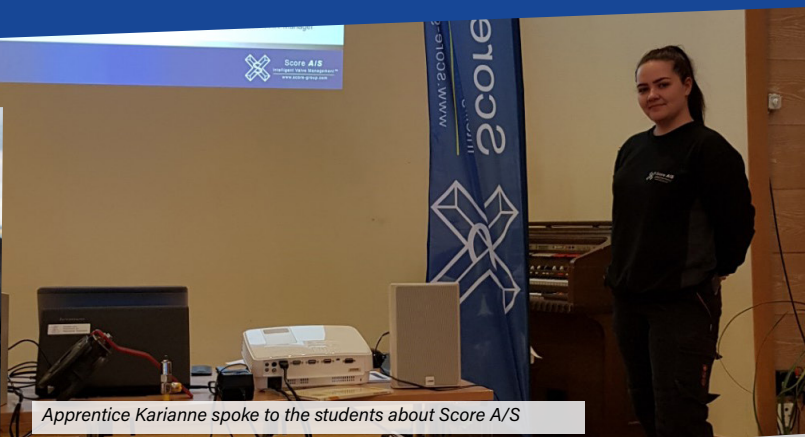
A/S Attend Stavanger Energy Conference 2019

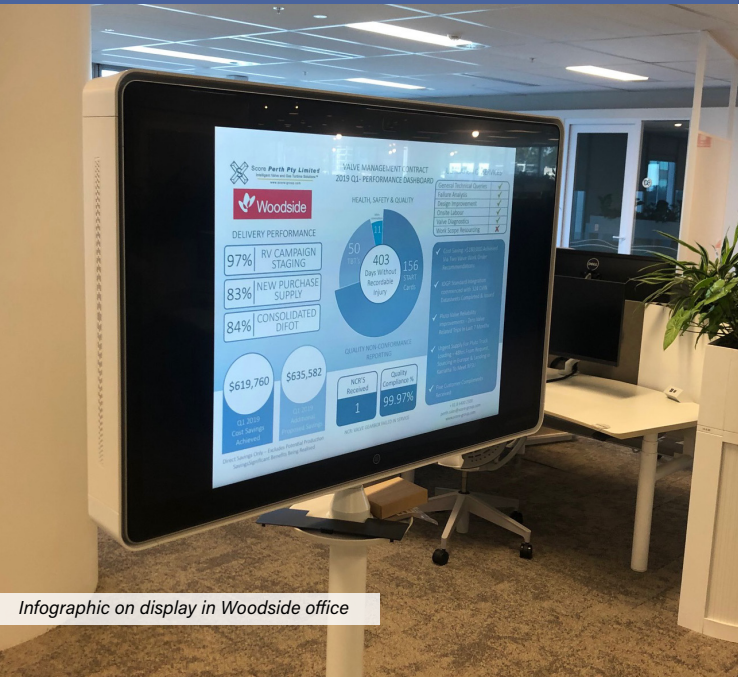

Julia Park Barry Building Opens at Admiralty Gateway

Friday June 28th is a historic day for the town of Peterhead as a new museum named and dedicated to the Julia Park Barry of Glasgow was officially opened. The RNLB Julia Park Barry was stationed in the town from 1939 through to 1969 and saved 496 lives during its service.

The Watson-class lifeboat was built out of a £9000 gift by Mrs Julia Park Barry who died on 27th March 1939, and arrived in Peterhead on 16th June of the same year. During her service she was instrumental in many rescues and notably, facilitated the rescue of 90 seamen in March 1942 over a 75-hour period, which earned Coxswain John B McLean the RNLI Gold Medal, the first to be awarded in Scotland in 104 years.

After she served in Peterhead, The Julia Park Barry remained as a RNLI relief lifeboat through to 1979. The vessel was then returned to Peterhead in 2013 after being purchased by Professor Sir Lewis D Ritchie OBE FRSE. The plan was to restore and create a museum in the port of Peterhead but financially, this proved very difficult. An offer then came from the late Charles Ritchie, founder of Score Group plc, to not only accommodate the vessel but to also restore and create the museum for future generations to experience.

The Julia Park Barry of Glasgow made its final voyage to Admiralty Gateway in May 2015 where over the last 4 years she has been restored and become centrepiece of this museum bearing her name.

The dedication was opened by Conrad Ritchie, Managing Director of Score International who has driven the project over the last 2 years.

He gave a brief history of the vessel before thanking the many people who have worked on various aspects of the project. He then invited Professor Sir Lewis D Ritchie to the podium to say

a few words. Sir Lewis Ritchie expanded a little on what Conrad had said but also emphasised the thanks to the crews of lifeboats for their bravery and at time sacrifice. He then unveiled the plaque to much applause from the gathered guests. John Wallace, former chairman of Peterhead Port Authority then gave a final vote of thanks to complete the formal proceedings.

Sir Lewis Ritchie was then invited to be the first official visitor to the museum followed by the other guests. All were delighted to then see the Julia Park Barry of Glasgow pride of place and fully restored like she had been back in 1939.

The museum proudly displays the lifeboat and tells her story alongside the history of lifeboats stationed in the town from 1865. It is assured to become a very popular attraction within the grounds of Admiralty Gateway which is also home to Peterhead Prison Museum and attracts tens of thousands of visitors each year. The museum opened to the public on 22nd July during Peterhead Scottish Week.

A similar paper on Digitalisation in the valve industry was also presented at the annual Reliability Conference in Seattle. That audience is always very receptive to our content, as they view us as market leaders in the valve condition and performance monitoring marketplace.

Score Diagnostics were also requested by the American Nuclear Industry's Safety Relief Valve Users Group (SRVUG) Chairman to present to them for the first time on the benefits of the MIDAS Meter® at their annual Conference. Alan Riddle rose to the challenge and was very warmly received by this audience. This has further enhanced our reputation in the USA Nuclear Industry. We are continuing to follow up on the leads we have generated from all these conferences attended.

Recognising our own team's development needs, we have also started an initiative of presenting these papers to our Score Teams too. This will ensure all our customer-facing personnel fully understand our products and services and what value they can add for our Score group-wide customers. This has already been rolled out in Peterhead (partially), Houston, KL and Dammam. Further sessions are still to be arranged for Peterhead (Directors and Managers), England, Norway, Canada and Australia. We will be attempting to make these sessions happen before the end of 2019.

In terms of our sales targets, we are ahead of where we expected to be at this time in the trading year and with a further push to year end, we expect to finish the year ahead of our sales targets. Given these ongoing sales successes, we have had a lot of customer engagement activities, with training continuing to be a big focus. 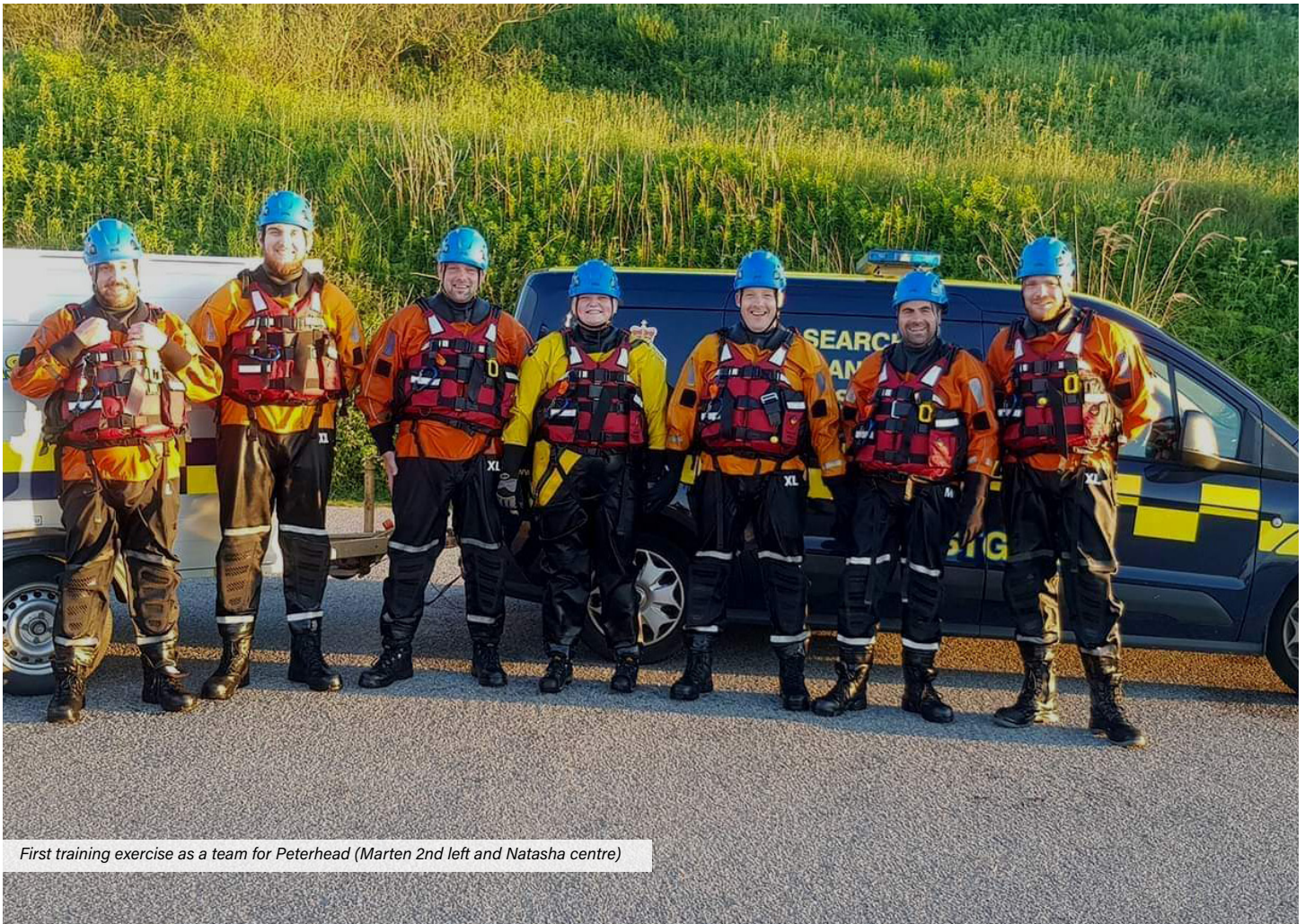

This challenging process includes a fitness test, classroom learning, field survival training and using firearms, putting potential reserves through their paces. Scott also brought along his kit bag, giving the apprentices the chance to try it on.

There are opportunities to become a reserve in the Navy, Marines, Army and RAF, and females are now welcome in all parts of the MOD. Becoming a reserve is a paid position with access to welfare services, and provides several other benefits, including the opportunity to develop new skills, free sport training, and the chance to train and work with full time forces personnel.

Reserves have to commit to training one evening a week at a local base, one weekend a month of group training, and two weeks a year training away from home. Score supports all employees who decide to join and allow them to use Score holidays or unpaid leave while doing paid reserve training.

Score Personnel Volunteer to Help Contribute to Local Safety Along Our Coast

The Coastguard Rescue Service, which is part of Her Majesty's Coastguard, consists of volunteer rescue teams strategically located around our coast. Each team consists of volunteers drawn from the local community who are fully trained and equipped to carry out rescue work along the coastline. Teams can be called out at any time of the day or night, in all weathers, to search for missing people, to carry out cliff rescues or even free people trapped in mud. Volunteer Coastguard Rescue Officers come from all walks of life and they can be tasked to almost anything that involves assisting those in need of help around the coast.

As a volunteer rescue service, the Coastguard Rescue Service relies on members of the public coming forward to offer their time, effort and motivation freely to this important asset within the UK search and rescue framework. It also relies on the often invisible yet invaluable contribution from their families and employers who allow, the occasional disturbance when the pager alerts the volunteer to an emergency where lives may be at risk. Not only does the volunteer feel obliged to respond, but it is, after all, what they volunteered to do, which is to serve their community by helping local residents or visitors when fun or work turns to trouble on the coast.

With over 200 years of history, volunteers of the Peterhead Coastguard have been saving lives along our coastlines. Working alongside other organisations such as RNLI Lifeboat, Grampian Police, and Fire and Ambulance services, these volunteers are on 24/7 call, ready to assist in an emergency at any time.

Marten Ritchie of Score Energy Limited and Natasha Sutherland of Score (Europe) Limited have recently undergone core training from knot tying, to Emergency Responder Casualty Care training, and various rescue disciplines. The training was a mixture of classroom based theory and practical activities, providing them with crucial knowledge and skills required to assist fellow team mates in the event of a crisis at sea, or along the shoreline which could play a vital part in saving someone's life.

With over 352 coastguard stations in various locations around the UK, Peterhead currently hold a team of 8 volunteers, who this year alone has responded to over 16 call outs.

National Recognition for PeterDeen Project

Last year, Score Group plc joined an innovative partnership alongside Peterhead Academy and two local north-east football clubs to encourage local pupils to reach their education goals.

In May the PeterDeen project was recognised at national level, winning the SPFL (Scottish Professional Football League) Trust's Community Project of the Year Award at Tuesday's SPFL Trust Conference in Hampden.

Two participating pupils from Peterhead Academy presented to the conference on the success of the project and upon winning, collected the award in front of representatives from SPFL clubs, the Scottish Government, the SPFL and the Scottish FA.

This alternative school curriculum combines core subjects like English and Maths, with life and work skills, alongside football coaching sessions, for pupils who struggled with traditional curriculums. Since starting in August, the programme has seen a 50% increase in school attendance rates among the 18 third-year pupils participating.
